

Lesson Name: Click ,Clack, Moo Adjectives Too!

Instructional Objective:

The Learner Will (TLW)...

- listen to the story Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type by Doreen Cronin.
- describe the characters of Click, Clack Moo Cows That Type with adjectives.
- learn about the correct spellings of new vocabulary through the implementation of teacher modeling.
- demonstrate comprehension of the book by explaining character attributes with the use of adjectives.

Materials and Media:

- Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type by Doreen Cronin.
- Dry Erase Board
- Dry Erase Markers

Lesson

Set:

We are going to fill this adjective barn with adjectives. Think about the leaf project you completed to describe Fall. Can anyone recall what adjective you used for that project? Yes. Adjectives describe a person, place or thing. Now think of the character and how they act, dress, or any other detail you may remember. Who would like to share their adjective?

Instruction:

- Read Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type by Doreen Cronin.
- Draw The Adjective Barn (Can be completed pre-lesson.)
- Write in the characters names into the roof portion of the barn.
- Ask the students to fill the structure with adjectives about the characters of Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type.
- Write all responses the student's share during the lesson.

Closure:

Students will complete future writing samples using adjectives. The adjectives are going to be used in the future to complete various bulletin-board activities.

Assessment and Evaluation:

Students understanding will be measured by teacher observation and oral feedback. Students will demonstrate their comprehension of the characters by using adjectives relating to the plot and specific detail from the story. Students will use adjectives in their future writings to display their knowledge of adjectives. Students complete personal statements which are to be prompted by the teacher in a class-wide discussion. A word wall or the adjective barn may be referred to when the student completes writing assignments.

Reflection:

This lesson was a really great way to teach adjectives. The students were eager to share their adjective with the class. There was a bit of competition between the students to fill the barn with adjectives. If given the chance, I plan to use this lesson in the future. One modification I would make to this lesson would have been writing a cloze paragraph for the students to fill in with oral responses.
